

Dear parents and carers,

Little Jarjums Preschool has developed a comprehensive SunSmart policy that meets the guidelines of Cancer Council NSW. The policy aims to improve the health of children, staff and carers in the service by reducing their risks of skin damage and skin cancer. As part of this policy we ask that parents and carers apply sunscreen supplied by the service to their child on arrival at preschool. Sunscreen is consistently applied to the children before going outdoors. Daily routines are planned so outdoor activities occur in short 90 minute increments. If exposed to sun for longer than 90 minutes, sunscreen will be reapplied.

Little Jarjums Preschool supplies 'SPF 50+ Ultra Protect Sunscreen'. If your child is unable to use this brand or type of sunscreen you are welcome to supply the preschool with appropriate sunscreen labelled with your child's name.
