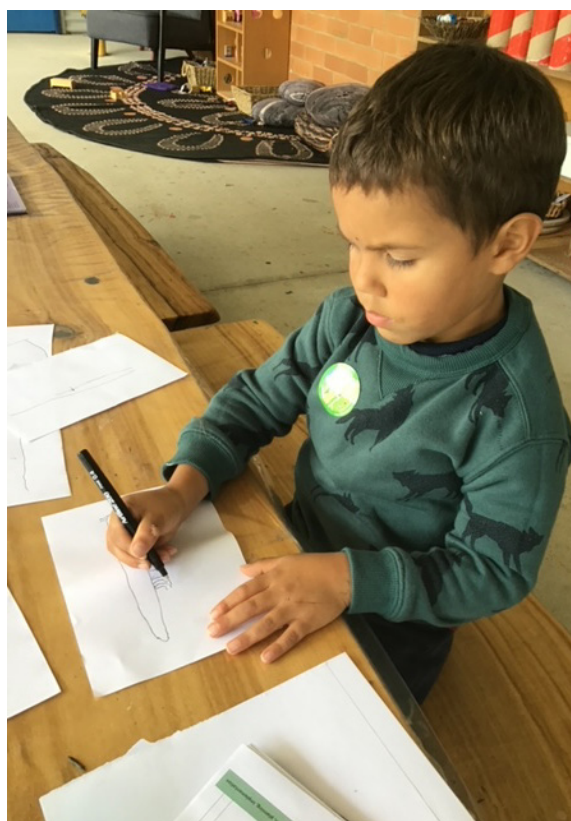
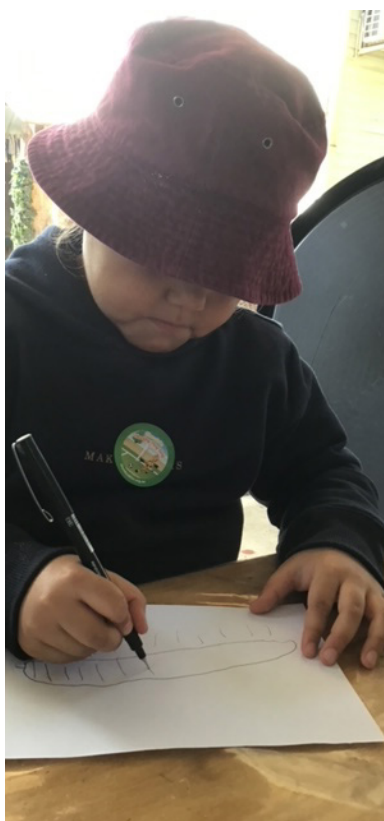

## Is it a worm?

Last week James found what he believed to be a worm in our indoor learning space. Each jarjum looked at the creature and stated one of its physical features to the group i.e. long body. As a group we mind mapped their answers. This led us to believe that it may not be a worm after all as the creature had many many legs, and we didn't think worms had legs. To extend this the children drew a picture of the creature to show a visual representation of the physical features we had discussed.

We used information technology to research the features that we had identified and concluded that we believed it was a centipede.





**Mud kitchen** Last week our Gurrahan group were exploring our outdoor learning environment. They began playing in the back garden that consisted of a lot of dirt and one old shrub. To extend this, Educators came up with the idea to turn the garden into a mud kitchen. We dug out the shrub and used water to dampen the dirt and turn it into mud. We added pots, pans and utensils. The children spent the afternoon cooking lots of different recipes in their new mud kitchen.



## FACT

Children are small, harder to see, behave unpredictably and are extremely vulnerable. They need **you** to take extra care when driving and parking around school zones

### NO PARKING

**No waiting.** You have **two minutes** to drop-off or pick-up. You must stay within **three metres** of your vehicle



### NO STOPPING

You must not stop on a length of road with a no **stopping** sign. The first **10 metres** from an **intersection** is a no stopping zone. **Yellow kerb** lines are also a no stopping zone.



### BUS ZONE

Only a public bus can stop in a bus zone



### MOBILE PHONES

Extra fines apply for using a mobile phone in a school zone. *May be subject to Double Demerits.*



### SPEEDING OFFENCES

**40km/h** is the limit. Children are vulnerable, so slow down in school zones. *May be subject to Double Demerits.*



### DRIVEWAYS & FOOTPATHS

Do not park on or across a driveway or footpath.



### PEDESTRIAN CROSSING

1. In a queue of traffic, **no part of your vehicle can stop** on a pedestrian crossing.  
2. Do not let **your children in or out of a vehicle** at a pedestrian crossing as this is a no stopping zone.



### U TURNS

U turns are illegal on or near a pedestrian crossing and across a double white line



### DOUBLE PARKING

Double parking is illegal and is very dangerous in a school zone.
