Rationale


Through the development of a SEMP Students will -

- develop a greater understanding of the impact of people on the environment;
- gain a greater appreciation and understanding of the principles of sustainable development;
- use their knowledge of environmental management practices to apply strategies within the school environment and local community;
- be able to identify the areas of the school environment that they can manage more effectively;
- design and implement ways of monitoring, evaluating, reviewing and reporting the SEMP;
- try to encourage all of the school community to improve their environmental performance and gain an understanding of their place in the whole community;
- make a lifetime commitment to environmental management practices at both the individual and community level.

It encompasses 3 areas:

- 1. Curriculum
- 2. Management of Resources
- 3. Management of School Grounds

Management of Curriculum



Environmental concepts and activities will be included in units of work so they are "seamless" and "embedded" in the teaching program and are part of the syllabus outcomes. Where appropriate, lessons will involve students in "actions for the environment" so students will live in and help manage an environmentally friendly school.

According to an audit conducted 4/8/21, CWPS teaches Environmental Education Outcomes across all years and KLAs. The majority of Environmental Education is incidentally taught as part of other topics, therefore holistically. The main improvement teachers of CWPS Public School can plan to make with regards to teaching Environmental Education would be to consciously emphasise Climate Change and Sustainability when teaching.

Management of Resources - Energy, Water, Waste



Energy

On the 4/8/21 Casino West Public School's Green Team audited the school's Electrical Appliances and examined the Energy Usage in the past year via Electricity Bills. On 4/8/21 the CWPS Green Team developed a list of strategies for improving the management of energy usage around our school based on the energy audit data collected.

Water

On the 4/8/21 Casino West Public School's Green Team audited the school's water outlets/taps and examined the Water Usage in the past year via Water Bills.

On 4/8/21 the CWPS Green Team developed a list of strategies for improving the management of water usage around our school based on the water audit data collected.

Waste

On the 4/8/21 Casino West Public School's Green Team conducted a waste audit examining what goes in our bins in one day and calculating this out over a year. The CWPS Green Team also discussed what percentage could be recycled, reused, reduced etc.

On 4/8/21 the CWPS Green Team developed a list of strategies for reducing the amount of landfill waste we as a whole school create and for increasing the opportunities for the school community to recycle/reduce their waste.

Management of school grounds



On the 4/8/21 Casino West Public School's Green Team conducted an audit examining the biodiversity present in the school grounds.
