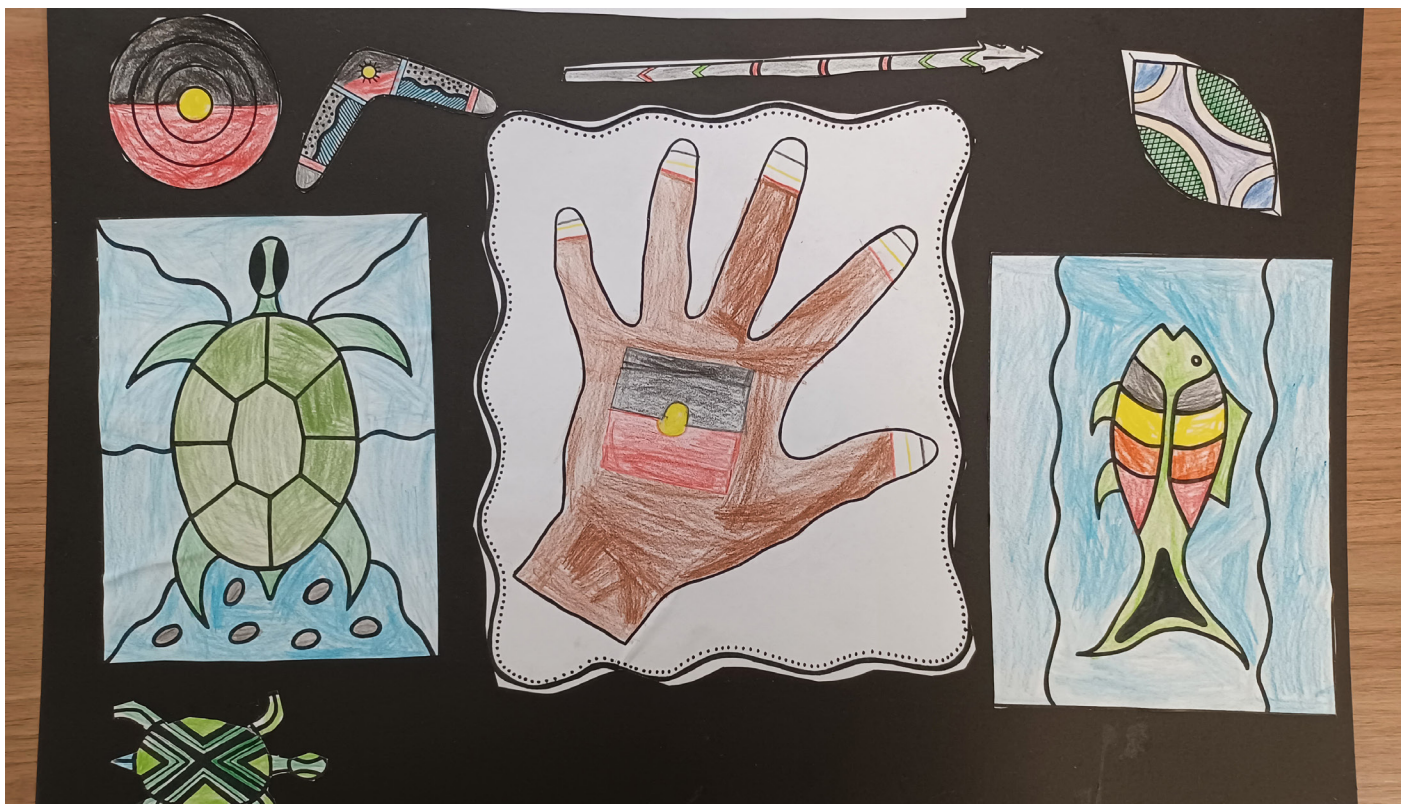
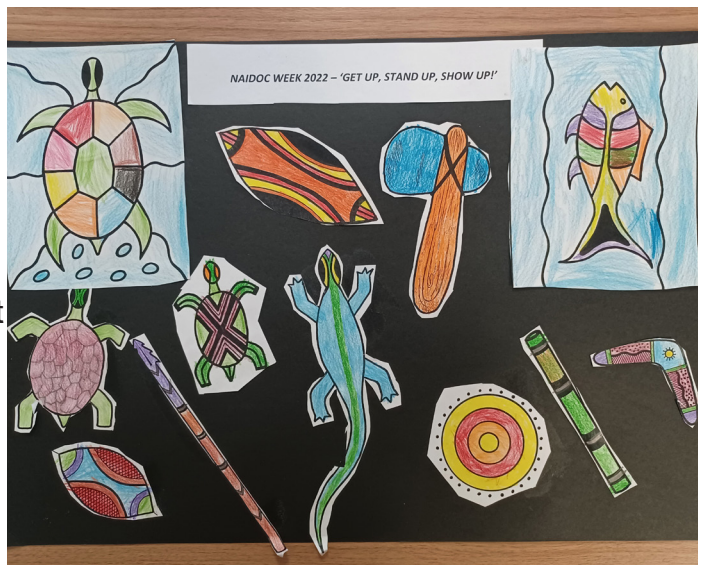


From the library desk
