

 activity or pastime

- Give children the pride of ownership and choice, and empower children to choose books they WANT to read rather than the books they are told to read
- Foster self-driven learning through a connection to books and reading
- Develop children's creativity and imagination
- Give children a better start in order to open up choices and opportunities in later life

Students will choose their books tomorrow and will receive their packs in the last week of term at a special assembly on Monday 3 April.




Our value this week is PATIENCE

Parking and traffic rules in school zones

You need to take extra care when driving and parking in school zones. Make sure that you and your child understand the road rules. If you break the traffic rules in a school zone you are putting not only your child but other children at risk. The parking and traffic rules around our schools are there to protect your children. If you break the rules you will be fined. Please choose safety over convenience.

ZONE	WHAT DOES IT MEAN?	WHY IS IT THERE?	PENALTY	DEMERIT POINTS*
You cannot stop in a NO STOPPING zone for any reason (including queuing or waiting for a space).		Keeps clear sight lines between drivers and children / pedestrians.	\$362	School Zone 2
P	You can stop in a NO PARKING zone for a max. of two minutes to drop off and pick up passengers. If no spaces are available you cannot queue on the road way or in any other zones while waiting for a space. You will need to drive away and park elsewhere, only returning when there is space to pull up. You must stay within 3 metres of your vehicle at all times and cannot leave your vehicle unattended.	Provides a safe place for children / pedestrian set down and pick up.	\$201	School Zone 2
BUS ZONE	You must not stop or park in a BUS ZONE for any reason (including queuing or waiting for a space) unless you are driving a bus. If times are shown on the sign, you are not allowed to stop during those times.	Provides a safe place for large buses to set down and pick up school children.	\$362	School Zone 2
	You must not stop on or within 20 metres before a PEDESTRIAN CROSSING or 10 metres after a crossing unless there is a control sign permitting parking.	So drivers can clearly see pedestrians on the crossing.	\$481	School Zone 2
X (EI)	DOUBLE PARKING You must not stop on the road adjacent to another vehicle at any time even to drop off or pick up passengers.	Double parking blocks visibility and forces other cars to go around you.	\$362	School Zone 2
43	You must not stop on any FOOTPATH or NATURE STRIP, or even a DRIVEWAY crossing a footpath or nature strip for any reason.	You could easily run over a child or force pedestrians onto the road to get around you.	\$201	School Zone 2

- Relocation
- Natural disasters

Seasons for Growth aims to strengthen the social and emotional wellbeing of children and young people by:

- Exploring the impact of change and loss on every-day life
- Learning new ways to respond to these changes.

Program Structure

The Seasons for Growth Children and Young People's Program is a small group program which runs for 45 minutes over eight weeks. The program offers four levels with tailored, developmentally appropriate activities and discussions.

Level 1: 6-8 years
Level 2: 9-10 years
Level 3: 11-12 years
Level 4: 13-18 years

Each session explores a theme using the seasonal imagery:

- + Life is like the Seasons
- + Change is Part of Life
- Valuing My Story
- Caring for my Feelings
- Making Good Choices

The program provides a safe space for children and young people where they can give voice to their experiences, understand their feelings, learn problem-solving and decision making skills, develop friendships, and recognise they are not alone.

A *Seasons for Growth* journal is provided to each participant to document their learning journey.

Back to School Bus Safety

With the school holidays coming to an end and students heading back to school this week, motorists are asked to make safe driving their number-one priority.

For motorists

 School zones are now back in force. Reduced speed limits and additional demerit points apply.



- Sticking to the speed limit and following the road rules in school zones.
- You must also slow down to 40km/h when bus lights are flashing.
- Lights flash on buses to warn motorists that buses are picking up and dropping off children.
- Looking out for children crossing the road near bus stops, in school zones or along bus routes.
- Giving way to buses when they merge back into traffic.

For parents

 Never drop off or meet your child on the opposite side of the road to the bus stop or call them across the road.



- Always drop them off or meet them on the same side of the road as the bus stop.
- Remind your children to always wait until the bus has gone before choosing a safe place to cross the road.
