





Our Jarjums are constantly engaging in inquirybased learning processes that are extended from their spontaneous interests in their play. Last week the children showed an interest in catching bugs. The children caught a range of different bugs, including moths, stick insects and crickets. Lacy took this interest further and used a whiteboard to draw what her bug looked like. Lacy wasn't sure what species the bug was but could identify the body parts and characteristics she could see. Lacy used her thinking and planning floor book to draw her bug and label the parts she could see. We then used the interactive whiteboard to research what bugs have those identified features. Our research showed that Lacy had found a Northern Mole Cricket. Lacy then got the opportunity to go to big school and share her work with Mrs Mills and received a Principal's sticker.




