

# **Boogle Bare**

# **Bush Tomato and Wattleseed Muffins**





- 90g butter
- · I cup castor sugar
- · 11/4 cups milk · legg
- I cup ground bush tomatoes
- 1/2 cup ground wattleseed
- I tbs ground lemon myrtle



# Method

- 1. Sift flour into large bowl and rub in butter
- 2. Stir in sugar, milk and eggs being careful not to over mix
- 3. Add bush tomatoes, wattleseed and lemon myrtle leaving a little of each to sprinkle on top
- 4. Spoon mixture into muffin patty
- 5. Place 2 or 3 bush tomatoes on top of each muffin and dust with wattleseed and lemon myrtle
- 6. Bake for 180c for 20 minutes Enjoy!

# **Magpie Facts**


They live for around 25 years, usually in the same place.

# School Student Broadband Initiative (SSBI)

To boost education opportunities and narrow the digital divide, the Australian Government has invested \$8.8 million to provide up to 30,000 qualifying families and carers with school age children and do not have an active nbn connection at home, with a free National Broadband Network (NBN) service until 31 December 2025. To check if you qualify follow these simple steps.

Contact the National Referral Centre, on 1800 954 610 (Mon–Fri, 10am–6pm AEDT), www.anglicarevic.org.au/student-internet. Callback, webchat and interpreting services also available.


The National Referral Centre team will check your residential address and ask your some basic questions to determine if you qualify for the School Student Broadband Initiative. If you qualify, you will be issued a voucher which can be redeemed at any of the participating internet providers. The National Referral Centre will also be available to assist with contacting your chosen internet provider or providing follow-up support.

# How to qualify for the School Student Broadband Initiative?

To qualify families and carers must:

- Have a school age student at home (full or part time), enrolled in an Australian school (up to year 12 including Prep in Qld/Vic/Tas, Kindergarten in NSW, Reception in SA, Transition in NT/ACT and Pre-Primary in WA).
- Not have an active NBN network internet service at your current residential address now or in the past 14 days (having a mobile internet service does not affect eligibility).
- Live in a premise that can access the NBN network through a standard connection.
- Families and carers can directly contact the National Referral Centre to check if they qualify or be referred by a participating nominating organisation.
