I thought I might share an easy recipe using native ingredients. This week we have Lemon Myrtle Pancakes.

You could make these with your jarjums at home or send them as a lunchbox treat. If you have any recipes that you would like to share, please send them in.

LEMON MYRTLE PANCAKES serves 4

Ingredients

- I tbs Lemon Myrtle
- 250ml milk
- l egg
- I cup self raising flour
- 3tbs sugar
- 1/2 tsp bi carb soda
- Pinch of salt
- Butter for frying



Method

- I. Whack all ingredients in your mixer and set on high for about 3 minutes until the mix is smooth and bubbly, alternatively whisk until lumps are gone
- 2. Wipe fry pan with butter over medium heat.
- 3. Pour dollops into fry pan. After bubbles have risen and popped, flip over until golden brown
- 4. Serve with ice-cream and enjoy!

NEW INITIATIVE! Calling all children and teenagers in our area for entries for a "handson" Beef Week project. There are certificates and prizes to be won in different age categories.

Preschoolers Beef Week Project (5 and under)

Preschool children are invited to submit their own model of a beef cow made with playdough. The model needs to be submitted standing on a paper plate or piece of cardboard with the name, preschool name and age of the child and the chosen name of the cow



Diorama Project (Kindergarten to Year 10)

Create your own diorama (model in a box) depicting the life of a beef cow. You can use a variety of craft materials to make your diorama attractive. The dioramas will be judged on creativity, effort and attractiveness. Students from Year 5 and above need to attach on information paragraph about their diorama. This can be glued to the side or the back of the box. Suggested size for the diorama is a shoe box but not much bigger than this please. Make sure your name, school and age are clearly on the dior



All projects need to be submitted to your preschool or school by Wednesday 21 May 2025 so I can pick them up. I will be judging these with a panel, organising the certificates and the prizes to go back with them to the schools. All entries need to have ne, age and school on them.
