

Stay healthy this winter

Dear parents and carers,

As we enter the winter season, respiratory viruses such as influenza, also known as flu, are expected to rise.

NSW Health has a number of resources to support you and your family this winter:

Book your family's flu vaccination External link for the best protection from getting sick. Recommended for everyone aged 6 months and over. Stay informed about vaccinations External link and access translated vaccine information External link.

Help stop the spread of cold and flu by practicing good general hygiene including:

- regular handwashing for at least 20 seconds (Need a timer? Get your child to hum the "Happy Birthday" song from beginning to end twice);
- · using hand sanitiser;
- · covering coughs and sneezes;
- cleaning frequently touched surfaces, particularly when people are sick; and
- not visiting people who are at higher risk of severe illness if you have cold or flu symptoms, especially babies and older people.
- call healthdirect External link on 1800 022 222 for free health advice, care and treatment for non-life threatening conditions from a registered nurse. They can find you a nearby doctor, pharmacist, urgent care service or connect you to specialist virtual care.

Your child will need to stay home, if they are sick with multiple or severe respiratory symptoms, symptoms that are worsening, or other signs like fever, rash, or tiredness.

Please let us know as soon as possible if your child is sick, absent or needs to attend a medical appointment during school hours.

Our teachers are here to help your child's continued learning and return to school once they are well enough.

Take care this winter and thank you for supporting our school community.

ARE YOUR CONTACT DETAILS UP TO DATE?

Sometimes we will need to contact you, including on the day that your child is absent, or if you haven't notified the school with a reason for your child being away.

If your contact details are out of date or if you're not sure, please contact us on 6662 1916 so we can update our records and can contact you quickly when we need to.

Please include parent/carers name, address, phone numbers, email address and emergency contact details. Please remember to contact the school if any of these details or your circumstances change. This is particularly important so we can work together to protect the wellbeing of our students through the reporting and monitoring of student absences.

LET US KNOW IF YOUR CHILD IS ABSENT

The wellbeing of our students is extremely important to us. One way we protect the wellbeing of your child is by fulfilling our responsibilities as both parents/carers and school staff by reporting and monitoring student absences.

Please remember to contact us on 6662 1916. This is best done early in the morning if your child is going to be away or late for school so your child's absence can be recorded correctly and we can provide appropriate support for you and your family.

Discover Nature at Dorroughby!

Recently, our support classes embarked on an exciting excursion to the Dorroughby Environmental Education Centre, where students had the opportunity to immerse themselves in nature and enhance their understanding of the environment.

The day began with a thrilling platypus session, where students observed these unique animals in their natural habitat. Next, students participated in a hands-on activity to assess water quality. Using net dipping techniques, they identified various macroinvertebrates, learning about their roles in the aquatic environment. This practical assessment provided valuable insights into the health of the local waterway.

In addition to exploring water quality, the students participated in an informative discussion about the significance of insects in our ecosystem. They learned how insects contribute to pollination, decomposition and maintaining ecological balance. They got to view the insects under microscopes and even created an insect.

Overall, the excursion to Dorroughby Environmental Education Centre was a resounding success, fostering curiosity and a greater understanding of environmental science among our students.


